

St Philip's P.E. and School Sport Premium Funding Report: 2016/2017

What is School Sports Premium and what are the aims?

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that schools should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Funding can be used to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

Spending 2016-2017:

Total PE premium grant: £8935

- 1) PE specialist advisory consultancy and staff development for the 2016-2017 academic year.

Total: £7475

Impact

- 21% of pupils accessed the after school sports and football clubs
- 43% of pupils tried a new sport at school last year
- 6% of pupils took up a new sport after trying it at school last year
- 100% of staff reported they had improved their skills and knowledge for teaching PE

2) After school football and netball club

Total - £300

Impact

- 17% of Y5 and Y6 children participated in netball club and tournaments
- 36% of Y5 and Y6 children participated in football club and tournaments

3) Competitive Alliance inter-school sports tournaments and internal school tournaments – Arranged by Alliance Secondary School – PE specialists.

Total - £1215

Impact

- 27% of pupils entered an external competitive event through school last year
- 30% of pupils had the opportunity to engage in external non-competitive sporting opportunities
- 100% of pupils engaged in competitive school activities
